Sevenoaks crush Sheffield to go clear at the top

The Sevenoaks Suns returned to league action on Saturday in the Womens British Basketball League Championship (WBBL) crushing the Sheffield Hatters 84pts to 52pts.

They inflicted only a second league loss on the Hatters with a rampant performance from tip to buzzer as they reacted to being unexpectedly dumped out of the WBBL Cup last weekend.

Long road trips can be a tiring and daunting affair for many clubs in a variety of sports, and the same goes for the Sevenoaks Suns womens basketball team. A long journey up the M1 to Sheffield was just the start of this weekend's fantastic result for the club as the Hatters were, for many weeks, looking like the main challengers for the championship title and the team to beat.

So, there remains just one unblemished record in the WBBL Championship after the still perfect Suns made a serious statement of their title ambitions, and with only two league games lost since the start of 2017, they are now the team to

beat going into the second half of the season.

The Suns came straight out from the tip in this WBBL match and were up at the end of the first quarter 29-17. They continued their amazing play and by halftime they were winning 49-29.

The second half was a little more conservative however and although Sevenoaks' guns were blazing, the Hatters kept them to a 12-point game. Sevenoaks then turned up the heat and went on to win 84-52. There were some excellent boxing out by Suns who restricted Hatters to a paltry four offensive rebounds in the entire contest.

Game hero, Cat Carr, showed why she is one of the biggest stars in the WBBL with a fantastic effort that resulted in 27 points and eight assists.

Leading scorers for the Suns were Cat Carr (27pts), Tayani Clark (11pts), Renee Busch (10pts), Judit Fritz (10pts).

The Suns next match is a home fixture against Durham Palantines, who sit at the bottom of the table with no wins this season. The match will tip off at 3.00pm on Sunday 10th December at the Sennocke Centre.

Sevenoaks Town lose two cups ties in a week

Sevenoaks Town FC were knocked out of the FA Vase on Saturday afternoon by Thatcham Town FC, a week after losing 1-0 to Tunbridge Wells FC in the Kent Reliance Senior Trophy.

The match, held at Waterside Park near Reading, was the highest ever competitive fixture in Sevenoaks' long history, however the visitors finally succumbed and lost 3-1.

Sevenoaks manager Micky Collins said after the match on Twitter: "That was my last ever game in the vase and we didn't show up, so disappointed".

He continued on Sunday morning, saying "Waking up

today after a disappointing result yesterday is always rubbish [sic], as every manager knows, but my spirits have been lifted by some fantastic results from our youth section today.

Whilst Sevenoaks' cup runs have been keeping them busy, it was a great opportunity for their opponents in the league to get back on top. That has not happened though, as both Croydon FC and Corinthian FC have both stuttered, leaving Collins' black and blue army still top of the league and with five games in-hand over their nearest challengers.

Their next great run is surely one on their way to winning the league title.

Sevenoaks Powerchair their way to second place

Sevenoaks Powerchair Football Club took part in round three of the WFA Muscular Dystrophy Championship division at the end of November, competing in their final fixtures of 2017.

For the first time this season Oaks travelled with a fully fit squad, welcoming back England international Kyle Alexander, who had recovered from his summer back surgery. This has given the entire squad a lift, both on and off the pitch.

Saturday morning saw Sevenoaks face East Riding Eels and with their confidence high, the squad produced their best performance of the season to date. The returning Alexander completed a hat-trick shortly after the break and Myles Miller

got on the scoresheet, scoring his own hat-trick and Shaye Reid-Watson added another to complete a 7-0 victory.

Middlesbrough Reserves were the team's Saturday afternoon opponents. Oaks were 2-0 up at half time courtesy of strikes from Miller and Reid-Watson. Sevenoaks made it 3-0 two minutes into the second half to take all three points.

Sunday morning saw the most anticipated game of the season so far, against league leaders Leeds PFC. Both teams, to their credit, were positive with their play in an open game. Leeds started brightly with Sevenoaks growing into the half as time went on.

Leeds had a glorious chance near to half time, switching play from one side to the other their firmly struck effort ricochets off both Alexander and keeper Dan Stevens, fortune favoured the Oaks on that occasion and the ball was cleared.

Leeds started the second half on top with early possession and some half chances. Sevenoaks settled and had a chance of their own again, however they were let down by poor passing accuracy and mistimed shots. Miller thought he had won the game with thirty seconds remaining, bundling in at the near post, however the referee had already blown for a Leeds foul, meaning play was taken back. The game finished 0-0 and Sevenoaks will relish playing Leeds again in May – potentially a winner takes all fixture.

Sevenoaks rounded off their weekend with a 5-0 victory against Rotherham Wheelchair Wasps. Youngster Harry Bestwick scored his first national league goals, bagging four in the process. Alexander scored the fifth to complete a great weekend and conclusion to 2017.
