## Sevenoaks Hockey Club awarded £50,000 from Town Council after sale of Raleys Gym

Sevenoaks Town Council have awarded Sevenoaks Hockey Club £50,000, as part of the sale of Raleys Gym in the town centre.

We asked Club Captain, Richard Young, what this means for the club and how it will be spent, he said: "The club is ever increasing. Many of the local community now play hockey and we need to improve our facilities to match that demand.

"What the, very generous, Sevenoaks Town Council award means, is that we

can complete the process of improving Hollybush Lane's artificial pitch and pitch side facilities".

He continued: "We needed to re-lay the artificial surface, the important shock pad primary layer and the match day preparation room. In addition the facility fencing, substitution benches and technical area all needed moving and enhancing. The funds went towards that work in the Summer of 2017. Sevenoaks Sports kindly covered the opening of the improved facility then".

The new Mayor, Roderick Hogarth, will presented the club with an 'over-sized' cheque on Sunday at their Hollybush Lane pitch, just after the club hosted their Junior Scholarship trials.

Sevenoaks Hockey Club first applied for the funding back in 2016, with a lot of the work being done by club member, Chris Parvin. To be rewarded with such a significant investment by the Town Council, it shows that sport is alive and well in Sevenoaks, and that it is also high on the councils agenda.

## Sevenoaks Vine 1st XI succumb to Beckenham

**Kent Cricket League Premier 1st XI - Beckenham (315-4) beat Sevenoaks Vine (154 all out)**

Following last weekend's comprehensive victory against newly promoted Bromley Common, the Vine 1st XI travelled to the home of current champions Beckenham full of optimism. Having won the toss, the Vine elected to bowl first. This decision appeared to backfire with a rapid start by openers Robinson and Senn who together smashed 50 off the first 6 overs. The pair both completed 50's in rapid time, as the bowling was changed regularly in an attempt to stem the flow of runs.

With the score at 151, recently called up

Mike Thompson struck, taking the big wicket of Robinson for 80, caught in the deep by Miles Richardson. Senn soon followed falling lbw to Luke Schlemmer.

The innings of MacVicar would however take centre stage, who alongside Lennox continued where Robinson and Senn had left off, before John Bowden took the wicket for Lennox for 41. Tom Coldman then took the final wicket of Asad Ali, leaving MacVicar unbeaten on 94 at the close of the innings, and Beckenham striking an ominous score of 315-4.

The Vine chase began poorly, losing two wickets in rapid succession to the pace of Ali, removing Bowden and Butler in successive balls. Ali would then go onto taking the wicket of Kent

Professional Zak Crawley for 11. At 33-3, the Vine were struggling.

Barber and Schlemmer offered resistance and went about rebuilding the innings before Schlemmer was stumped by a superb piece of glovework by Robinson. Richardson then fell quickly to Nadir, and Aitken aided Barber well until falling for 19. It would then be Barber's turn to fall who after scoring an excellent 54, was caught and bowled by Clements.

Thompson and Coldman then offered some form of resistance before falling to Ali and Taylor respectively, prior to Ali taking his fifth wicket of the match by bowling Parsons to conclude a highly disappointing outing. They play in the A21 derby against Tunbridge Wells on Saturday.

## Anderson left stranded on 76 not out as Vine 2's fail to win

**Kent Cricket League Premier 2nd XI - Sevenoaks Vine 2nd (216 all out) lost to Beckenham 2nd (240-8)**

On a particularly blustery day with a mixture of youth and experience, Sevenoaks Vine 2nd's welcomed Beckenham for a crucial fixture where the Vine could enter the top half of the table for the first time this season.

After reluctantly losing the toss due to no umpire, Beckenham elected to bat on a flat Vine wicket. Piers Robinson and Karl Pearson opened the bowling and were looking to get some movement in the overcast conditions.

Beckenham negated the new ball well until Pearson made the early breakthrough. They then entered a difficult spell with the seamers struggling to gain any purchase from the wicket; Michael Cowdrey and Andy Reid-Dick then begun to slow the run rate down with Cowdrey (2-55) taking an outrageous catch off his own bowling.

Reid-Dick also gained reward for his tight spell finishing his 10 overs with 1-25. The returning Pearson (3-36), Evert Bekker (1-30) and Robinson (1-43) all chipped in at the death to limit Beckenham to a respectable total of 240-8.

The home sides chase did not start as

hoped, as they lost Chad Quinney early on, judged lbw. Bekker shortly followed with wickets of Chris White and Harry Houillon occurring in quick succession. Cowdrey and Anderson then batted beautifully together forming an 88 run partnership playing some brilliant shots, until Cowdrey was dubiously given lbw for an impressive 65.

From then on, the Vine struggled to form partnerships with Anderson against some tight bowling and remarkable keeping from the Beckenham glovesman

who ended up with seven catches.

Unfortunately, this left Anderson stranded on 76\* with the Vine falling 24 short of the target. The Vine 2nd's look to make amends next Saturday against Tunbridge Wells at Orchard Field where, if results go the Vines way, could mean a rise to fourth place going into Round nine.
