Sevenoaks Town are opening up the throttle ahead of FA Cup season opener

sevenoaks Town Football Club will face Lordswood FC in the FA Cup on Saturday 11th August, and they are preparing themselves well with preseason friendlies already underway.

Over the last few weeks, Sevenoaks have faced Margate, Dartford and Tonbridge Angels on their 3G pitch at Greatness Park and despite losing all three matches, there are significant improvements across the entire squad. This materialised on the pitch on Saturday afternoon when they travelled to a strong Deal Town side on the coast.

Micky Collins' Sevenoaks won twice at Deal during last season's title-winning campaign but they had to work hard to make it three in a row against a Deal team whose performance would have more than satisfied their manager, Derek Hares.

Sevenoaks went ahead in the match after the second of two penalties in the opening 11 minutes was put away by Frankie Sawyer. This was after Deal's keeper James Tonkin saved Mikey Dalton's first spot kick. Zac Attwood was brought down for both penalties.

Billy Bennett then doubled Sevenoaks' advantage just past the half hour mark, however three minutes later Sam Wilson headed home to produce a 2-1 interval scoreline.

Sevenoaks then regained their twogoal lead through substitute Josh Greenleafe's fierce 63rd-minute strike, but Deal kept plugging away and Wilson added his second with a sharp finish 15 minutes from time. Sevenoaks face a tough game against Maidstone United on Tuesday night before hosting Tunbridge Wells on Saturday.

Off the field, Micky Collins has had a busy summer making additions to his squad, whilst saying goodbye to others.

The recent signing of Andres Tobon, who has been on trial at the club recently, has already proved popular and he will give the team more pace and goalscoring opportunities.

Sevenoaks' incoming players this summer include Zac Attwood, Andres Tobon, Sam Crabb, Mikey Dalton, Rob Saunders and Jake McIntyre. Those who left the club are Jason Thompson, Corey Holder, Chris Edwards, Harrison Carnegie and Brett Ince.

Sevenoaks Vine start to lose ground on top two

Sevenoaks Vine 1st team were visitors to Lordswood on Saturday and on an extremely poor wicket, they narrowly lost by 15 runs in a low scoring match which see's them drop to fifth in the league.

The toss was going to be crucial and having won, Lordswood had no hesitation in batting first.

Tight bowling upfront by Karl Pearson and Miles Richardson restricted the home side to just 45 in the first 15 overs.

But a good counter attack from Lyndon Lockhart (56) and Jack Laraman (37) and useful contributions from most of their batsmen, plus a late flurry of runs from the lower order, saw them reach 210 all out in their 50 overs. Tom Coldman was the pick of the bowlers with 3 for 29 off his 10 overs which included a well executed run out and Mike Thomson again who took 4 for 45 off 8 overs.

Scoring freely was extremely hard as the wicket gradually broke up but the Vine were never out of the game thanks largely to an excellent 85 from the in form Mike Barber. He found some support from Evert Bekker who made 38 but with wickets falling at regular intervals the Lordswood total was just too much and the Vine were bowled out for 195 in the 50th over.

Special mention for Andrew Reid-Dick who as well as taking two wickets also took an amazing five catches. This is exceptionally rare for an outfielder and now specialist backward point.

They now turn their attention to the next home fixture against Bexley, who put in a strong performance against Beckenham on Saturday, bowling them out for a record low of 18 runs.

Vine 3rd climb out of relegation with win over Lordswood


