Sevenoaks undefeated after opening weekend

Sevenoaks Hockey Club Men's Indoor team competed in four games over the weekend in week one of the top Indoor Hockey league finishing in second place on goal difference to Hampstead & Westminster after winning all four of their games.

Sevenoaks had a small squad of just nine players. They started on Saturday morning apprehensively against last year's finalists, Bath Buccaneers. In a very close tense game goals from Oaks two External Players Rufus McNaught-Barrington (4) and Joe Naughalty (1) saw them come out 5-3 winners. McNaught-Barrington scored three Penalty Corners and one Penalty stroke. The gritty performance coming back from 1-3 down set the tone for the weekend. The squad played with passion and flare in front of the travelling Oaks supporters and remained positive throughout.

Stand In Coach and Captain Chris Barker with 14 years' Indoor experience played a solid controlling role at the back throughout and proved an effective Leader over the weekend as well as surprising many with his newly found Coaching talent. Supported in the back line by his equally experienced twin Brother Nick Barker and new recruit this season Craig Morton who added a new dimension to the team on and off the field, they all proved an effective platform to start numerous attacks.

Perhaps the difference this year from last (when Oaks just escaped relegation) was the new-found fire power upfront from our two guest players and back-in-form Oaks Ex England Junior George Torry and the ever reliable newly-wed David Smith.

Goalkeeper Richard Potton whose cabinet is already full of Indoor European medals, had an outstanding weekend and was especially effective defending penalty corners. The final squad member was Sam Ashenden with his debut for Oaks Indoor and gave a solid and effective performance.

In the second game on Saturday against Kent Rivals Holcombe Oaks came out 5-4 winners with a goal in the last

minute from Joe Naughalty. He got a further 2 goals, with others from David Smith and Nick Barker.

On Sunday Oaks started against other Kent Rival Canterbury snatching another close victory 4-3 after going 0-2 down. Oaks never showed any nerves when going behind and remained calm to come back to victory. 2 further goals from Naughalty, with others from Smith and Torry.

In the final game on Sunday afternoon Oaks confidence from 3 previous wins shone through and they played some sensational indoor hockey to demolish Brooklands MU from Manchester 7-2. Goals this time from Naughalty (2), McNaught-Barrington (2), Torry (2) and Smith sealed 4 victories and the maximum 12 points to take into week 2.

It was a superb team performance from the Oaks squad with every player contributing and the camaraderie within the squad was heartening. So much so that to pick out the Oaks player of the Tournament would always be difficult. However Nick Barker at the heart of the defence offered a near faultless performance and remained on the pitch for virtually all the games as well as offering several assists with his sublime stick work down the right flank.

Week two of the Indoor tournament is on the 5th & 6th January when Oaks face the 'big guns' of English Hockey with games against East Grinstead, Surbiton, Hampstead & Westminster and Wimbledon.

Suns take charge of the Championship once again

WBBL Championship: Sevenoaks Suns 89 Caledonia Pride 41

Sevenoaks Suns returned to the top of the WBBL Championship standings after maintaining their unbeaten start with a 89-41 win over Caledonia Pride on Sunday.

Len Busch's side now move to 8-0 with a clinical victory to leave Pride in the bottom half with a 3-7 record.

The hosts raced out of the blocks to establish a double-digit lead early on and moved further clear to lead 50-19 at the half and there was no way back.

Janice Monakana top scored with 23 points on 8 of 11 shooting with four steals with Judit Fritz (18) and Cat Carr (12) also hitting double figures

A key statistic in the match saw Sevenoaks shoot 60% from inside the arc

and were a perfect 20 of 20 from the foul line to set the platform for a convincing win

Busch commented after the match that he was surprised how well his team played. He said "I expected Caledonia to be pretty energetic, fiesty and be very competitive. I was a little bit surprised how well we played, with the easy baskets, we were obviously switched on for the first six or seven minutes, we



played really good basketball".

He continued: "I'm happy for the girls, we get to go into the Christmas break in a good mood, and then we come back and we're ready to just keep getting better".

Carr echoed Busch's comments stating that the team will enjoy the break but will get better when they return in January.

Sevenoaks' first match of the New Year will be a WBBL Cup semi-final away at Leicester Riders on January 5th. Carr said: "We have a really big game when we come back, we'll concentrate on that and the little things to make us better and better".

Sevenoaks are now unbeaten in their last 18 matches, with just the one loss against Riders last February in 37 matches.

Super Sid off the mark for West Kingsdown Boxing Club

George Welsh having his first bout since the school boy finals was involved in another thrilling contest this time against Charlie Martin of Team Wiseman. This was nip and tuck for three rounds with the hosts believing they had done enough after a big last

The show closer for this sold out event saw Simon Briggs step up in class against All Star's Ahmed Popoola. This light heavyweight bout ebbed and flowed for three rounds with Popoola enjoying a good second round which ultimately decided the contest in a close but unanimous decision in his favour.

Chipstead take top spot after win over Ide Hill

Chipstead ran out worthy winners in the top of the table clash at Wrotham on Saturday and in the process snatched top spot in the league from their local rivals at the half way stage of the season.

Due to injury and lack of availability, unfortunately, Ide Hill went in to kick off missing four of their first choice defenders, fielding something of a makeshift back line for their biggest game of the season.

And the start was evenly end to end, Chipstead breaking and attacking with poise, whilst Ide Hill always look sharp on the counter attack; a lovely floated Columb Grant long ball was pulled down on the run by Matt Bunn and his left footed strike was just tipped round the post by the Chipstead keeper.

Both teams continued to create chances in an equally matched first period, Mike McKay saving well with his

legs to smother a one on one, whilst Shaun Boyle dragged one just wide of the post when well-placed centrally in the box, and Grant firing over the bar when clean through on the left side of the box.

It was Chipstead who took the lead in after 55 minutes though; Ide Hill who had caused problems all game from corners, then conceded from one, Chris Steadman evading his marker at the near post and powering home for 1-0.

Ide Hill tried to rally but the thin squad was beginning to tell in the second period and Chipstead got in again down the right, the Chipstead forward being pulled down in the box when through and Alfie Kitt slotted the penalty in to the right corner off the post to double the lead.

Ide Hill's misery was further compounded on 70 minutes, a McKay clearance falling straight to Jack Highwood who guided into an empty net from 25 yards. Ide Hill did give

themselves a sniff of a comeback; A Grant inswinging free kick was headed over the keeper from the penalty spot by Craig Jackson to reduce the deficit.

The comeback was short lived though, with James Fitchett sealing an impressive away win for Chipstead, nodding home a free kick at the back post in the final few minutes. Honourable mentions to midfielders George Kensell and Ben Holder, who stood in as centre halves and fought brilliantly throughout, the latter being voted the Ide Hill man of the match for his efforts.

So Chipstead take top spot from Ide Hill, and notionally, with games in hand factored, tighten everything up and perhaps turns the league into a five horse title race heading into the New Year. Ide Hill know that if they win their games in hand they will retake their place at the top, but will have to be much stronger than they were in the second half on Saturday.
